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WHERE WERE YOU ON 9/11?

On August 15th, ESAM breakfast patrons were treated to a riveting presentation by Glens Falls-native **Gary Loughrey**. Gary spoke about his experiences as an airborne commercial pilot on September 11, 2001 when all aircraft overflying the United States were ordered "to land at the nearest suitable airport". This order came when the Federal Aviation Administration was unable to verify how many airplanes had been hijacked by terrorists.

Gary was piloting a US Airways flight from Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport to Kansas City International Airport on 9/11 when he received the FAA's order. He asked the FAA controller what was going on and was that the the United States was under attack. He informed his flight crew and enlisted a group of Marines who happened to be on his flight to ensure security in the passenger areas while he diverted to Indianapolis. His copilot smoothly made the steep descent needed to get into the landing pattern at Indianapolis, and, at one point, was the 6th of 60 planes headed to Indianapolis for landing.

Gary earned his Private License in 1970, graduated from USAF Pilot Training in 1978 and flew Lockheed C-141 transports at Charleston, South Carolina for nine years. He flew for US Airways for over 30 years. Later he flew aerial surveying for Bluesky Geospacial in North Adams, Massachusetts, and he continues to fly his 1947 Beechcraft Bonanza.

JACK O' LANTERNS AND JETS RETURNS ON OCTOBER 24TH

On Saturday, October 24th, another scary good time is in store for ghosts, goblins, skeletons, witches, and other Halloweeners. ESAM will host its annual Jack o' Lanterns and Jets program starting at 4:00 PM. The Flights for Veterans event at ESAM is a local tasting fundraiser hosted in partnership with the **Glenville Rotary** to benefit the **Capital Region Veterans Memorial** and the museum itself. It is a 21-and-older tasting event featuring beer, wine, cider, and spirits from over 25 local breweries, distilleries, and wineries, alongside food samples from regional restaurants, set right among the museum's aircraft. General Admission is \$40. VIP Tickets are \$60 (includes special access and tastings inside a C-130 aircraft). Designated Drivers are available at \$20. ESAM AGAIN SUPPORTS THE RUN THE RUNWAY

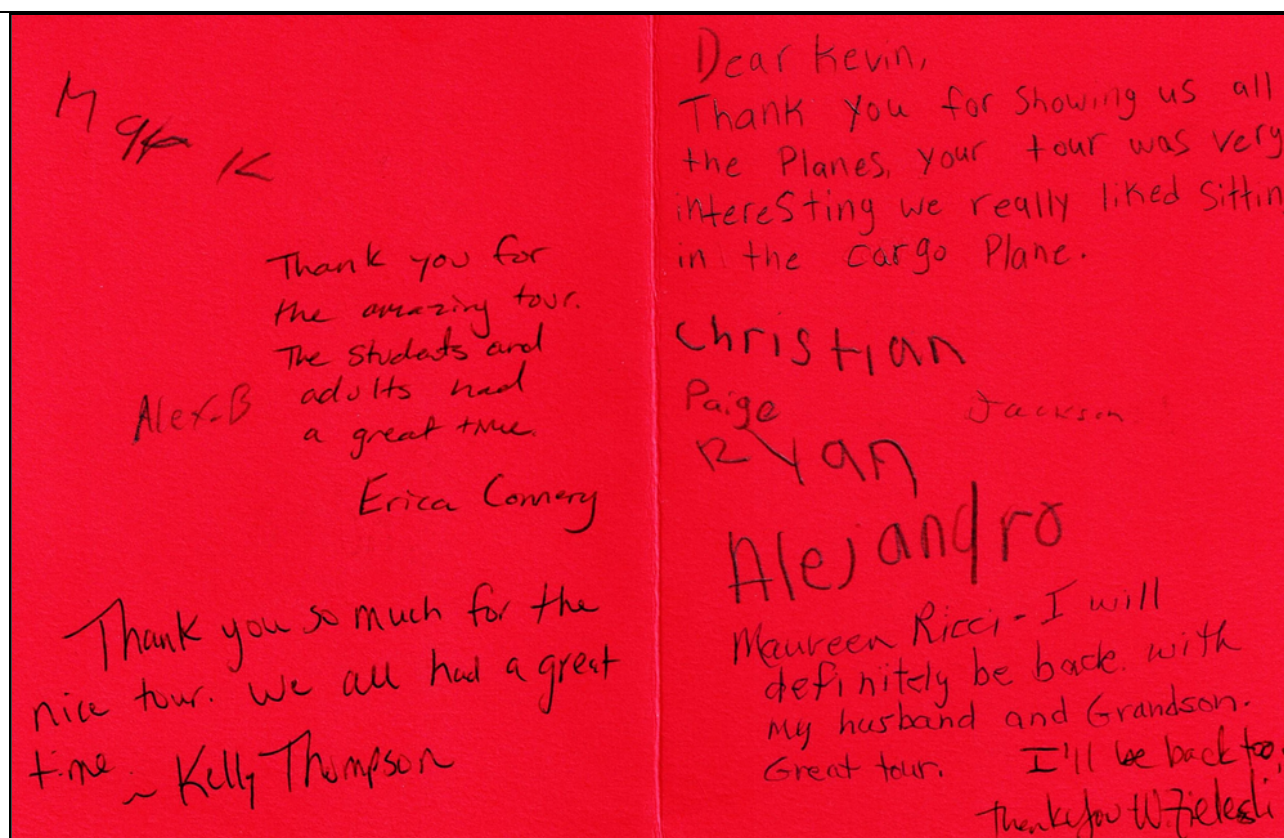
Fitness enthusiasts had a rare chance to run, jog, or walk on the massive runways and newly paved taxiways of the Schenectady County airport- an active hub that connects Schenectady County to the world, with 50,000 flight operations each year.

Starting at 10 am on September 12th, this unique 5K course took participants on the same runway used by the New York State Air National Guard's 109th Airlift Wing, and their iconic LC-130 "Ski Birds," the only aircraft in the world equipped to land on Antarctic ice.

Runners, joggers, and walkers of all ages were welcome. Young aviators, 12 and under, were invited to take off on a free 1-mile fun run down the main runway.

After the 5K, participants were able to taxi over to the Empire State Aerosciences Museum (ESAM) and enjoy free admission for the day, exploring the world of aviation and learning more about Schenectady County's legacy of flight.

ESAM RECEIVES LITTLE-WING AUTOGYRO

Thanks to the generosity of **Jim and Martha Sharer** (in photo below), ESAM now has in its collection a LW-3 Little-Wing Autogyro. Jim built the autogyro using plans provided by designer **Ron Heron** of Little Wing Autogyros, Inc.

Per the Internet, the Little Wing LW-3 is a single-seat, fabric-covered variant of the Little Wing autogyro family, optimized for enhanced cross-country performance compared to its ultralight predecessors. Unlike the LW-2 (which utilizes an elevator combined with a laterally tilting rotor head), the LW-3 features a universally tilting rotor head alongside a standard rudder for full 3-axis aerodynamic authority.

Thanks also to ESAM volunteers **Gary Davis** and **Dave Tripp** for making the trip to pick up the autogyro.
